EDITORIAL

Adult & Education Programme

Like yesteryear this year also the deptt of education, Bikali College, conducted a survey at Sutarpara village near by the College on the eve of world Literacy Day. A total of fifty families were surveyed in order to find out the literacy trend of those families. The survey report represents a lot of information like economic condition of families, attitude towards education, sexratio of education, people's adaptability in changing situation and other related information.

On the basis of the survey report the department had decided to hold adult education classes as many of the family holders seemed to be very interested to learn. Accordingly the students of the department started taking up classes right from 18th september/03 every sunday. A group of students comprising two or three had imparted classes as per stipulated time. It is to be mentioned in this regard that there was a spontaneous response of the local people to this noble purpose. Many householders what ever their educational status joined in the adult literacy classes. As reported by the local leaders that they were very much benefited by the literacy classes. Apart from giving the knowledge of three R'S we attempted to impart education on mother and child care, environmental consciousness, small savings, removal of bad social habits etc.
